Two identical women take very different paths through life, never meeting but coming to the same conclusions.

- BBC 2 – **Family Saga** – Factual Entertainment (2 episodes of 4 x 60 Minutes). *Each episode follows a group of families united by an event in the past. How did the imprisoning of two warring teenagers in the 19th Century effect their descendants today – and the descendants of the magistrate who sentenced them? How is it that some of the descendants of a destitute 19th Century woman are still on benefits, whilst others have become wealthy?*
- BBC 4 – **Climate Change: A Horizon Guide** – Documentary (60 minutes). *From the early pioneers in the 1950s to the general consensus of today, this documentary follows the scientific and political highs and lows of climate research.*
- BBC 4 – **Murder: A Horizon Guide** – Documentary (60 minutes). *What drives a person to murder? Are some people predisposed to kill? Are murderers born or made? This documentary looks at the history of the neurological and genetic research trying to answer these questions.*
- Qatar TV – **Fast Train to the Future** – Children's Drama (3 x 60 mins). *This science-fiction drama takes Qatari children on a train journey to their own futures, to see the exciting world that awaits them.*
- BBC 2 – **Cat Watch 2014: The New Horizon Experiment** – Documentary (60 mins). *One of a three part series looking at the behaviour of feral, city and village cats as they struggle to adjust their wild instincts to a domesticated environment.*

- BBC 4 – **Every Day Miracles** – Documentary (60 mins). *One of a two part series investigating the miracle of modern materials, from the steel used in razor blades to the nylon in stockings.*
- BBC 4 – **Great Scientists in Their Own Words: The Code of Life** – Documentary (60 mins). *This documentary tells the story of the genetics revolution, from the discovery of the structure of DNA, to the Human Genome Project, using extraordinary archive interviews with the scientists behind the discoveries.*
- BBC Worldwide – **How to Build a Planet** – Documentary (60 mins). *Using CGI, 'The Engineer' assembles the materials, and investigates the processes required to build a planet just like Earth, high above the Arizona desert.*
- BBC 4 – **Sex: A Horizon Guide** – Documentary (60 mins). *A history of the difficult and sometimes controversial research into human sexuality.*
- BBC 4 – **Car Crash: A Horizon Guide** – Documentary (60 mins). *Charting the science, engineering and politics that have led to the massive reduction in road deaths since the 1950s.*
- BBC 2 – **Horizon: The Truth about Personality** – Documentary (60 mins). *Michael Moseley takes a personal voyage to the frontiers of genetics and neuroscience to find out about the forces that shape all our personalities.*
- BBC 2 – **Horizon: Fracking – The New Energy Rush** – Documentary (60 mins). *Iain Stewart investigates why fracking is a potential game changer and meets some of the people who have got rich from fracking, as well as the communities worried about the risks.*
- BBC 2 – **Horizon: The Truth about Meteors** – Documentary (60 mins). *In the wake of the meteor that exploded over the Russian town of Chelyabinsk, Professor Iain Stewart explores what meteorites and asteroids are, where they come from, the danger they pose and the role they have played in Earth's history.*
- PBS/NOVA, Channel 5 – **Alien Planets Revealed** – Documentary (60 mins). *The programme charts the development and launch of the Kepler Space Telescope, and its mission to find planets orbiting distant stars. The programme explores some of the worlds it has discovered and discusses the nature of life that may evolve there.*
- BBC 2 – **Horizon: Defeating the Superbugs** – Documentary (60 mins). *Drug resistant bacteria are on the rise, from tuberculosis to MRSA. This programme explores the reasons why these superbugs are evolving, and what can be done to defeat them.*
- BBC 2 – **Horizon: Eat, Fast and Live Longer** – Documentary (60 mins). *Michael Moseley takes an intensely personal look into the science of fasting, and discovers that following a fasting regime has pulled him back from the brink of diabetes and high cholesterol.*
