A filmmaker of 29 years' broadcast experience; I'm a Director/Producer/Writer with self-shooting and editing skills. A strong believer in everyone having their own story to tell, I've directed documentaries, factual, drama and children's programmes for BBC, Channel 4, ITV, UKTV and Teachers TV. I've led crews of many shapes, sizes and temperaments (!), and from tots to an octogenarian comedienne, from chaotic teenagers to presenters I've worked with a diversity of people in front of the camera. An eclectic mix but what unites my work is a feel for the personality of contributors on screen (and a sensitivity to them as individuals on and off screen), a sense of visual imagery and an enjoyment of telling stories in an engaging way. "mad about elvis" (2017/18) Director/Co-Producer HD, 30'

Elvis is alive and well and, every September since 2004, partying hard in Wales. With 35,000 visitors, the majority in costume, the Porthcawl Elvis Festival is the largest in the world. Meeting people who like to lose themselves as Elvis and those who like to lose themselves watching make-believe Elvises, we explore why the lure of Elvis is still so intoxicating today. Angel and his cousin Santiago live in rural Peru. Along with helping his great-grandfather on their smallholding and collecting Lucuma fruit to make ice cream, Angel loves to explore the mountain, play in the banana grove and to dance. "the severn bridge at 50" (2016) Director/Co-Producer HD, 29'

Groundbreaking in concept, epitome of British 1960's engineering prowess, the iconic Severn Bridge made Britain world leaders in bridge design. Typical of the time though little thought was given to how it would be maintained. Battling the elements, today's specialist maintenance teams have to be every bit as inventive as the visionary engineers who built it, for to keep it safe every inch has to be in touching distance, not easy when suspended above the river with the highest tidal range in Britain. "timeshift: the people's liners" (2015) Director/Producer HD, 59'

A colourful voyage of high teas on the high seas, family pleasure trips and the original booze cruises in the company of passengers and crew of the steamers which plied between industrial cities and their nearest seaside and offered day trips from those resorts. Each ship attracted a devoted following, treating its passengers, whatever their pocket, to the trappings of an ocean voyage whilst rarely actually venturing out of sight of land. "on stage at the bristol old vic theatre school" Director, 29'

Making it as an actor is tough. With a London showcase, two large productions and a gala, the months before graduation are a whirlwind. From read through to opening night the students give it their all, whilst trying to find work in a notoriously precarious profession. "the mayor with the red trousers" (2013) Director, HD, 29'

George Ferguson: architect, social entrepreneur and now Bristol's first directly elected mayor. He took on the machines of the main political parties... and won. "ricky valance: my voice is my life" (2011/12) Director, HD, 40'

The first Welshman to reach Number 1, Ricky Valance's life has been defined by one monster hit: *Tell Laura I Love Her*. But what is like to be known for just one song when personally and professionally you feel you are so much more? With the industry in crisis dairy farmers face a fundamental choice: cut the crippling feed bill by returning to pasture farming or, chasing economies of scale, to expand massively. We meet three farmers, each striving to stay afloat, one who has chosen grass, a second who plans a 1,000 cow mega-dairy and a third who already keeps 1,650 cows in sheds all year and has applied for full planning retrospectively. "park life" (2008) Director, DVCam, 6 x 23'

"What type of people become zoo keepers?" muses Assistant Curator Jamie Craig, "it's a wide range from the glamorous, the handsome to anoraks who study one species of thrush for their entire lives". 259 species, (but sadly no thrushes) 24 keepers, 8 gardeners, this observational documentary series, set within the community of the Cotswold Wildlife Park explores the changing roles of zoos, observing relationships between people and animals in captivity and sharing in the passions and dedication of those who make the life and death decisions in a modern wildlife park. "the 9 lives of dudley sutton" (2008) Director, DVCam, 23'

"What's life about if it's not about friendship, children, grandchildren, mates?" Some people think they know him as Tinker in "Lovejoy" but Dudley Sutton has played more parts than cats have lives and, in this film, we meet Dudley as his friends know him. Dudley is writing a poem celebrating the lively lives of a high-living tomcat. Private and performing life mix as he persuades friends to appear in a film of the poem. **Quintessence Films**. "building wonders" (2007/2008) Director/Camera/Writer, DVCam, 2 x 23'

What do iconic structures tell us about the history of the time? Historian Julian Richards investigates the story of Gloucester Cathedral and the Fosse Way, trying to get into the minds of the people who designed and constructed them, searching for clues in the field and walking the CGI plans. You can build striking buildings but without consideration for the people who live there and the way the public spaces around them are used, they are no more than empty shells. "bring on the dancing girls" (2005) – Director/Producer – DVCam 29'

88-year-old Betty Hockey was the forces "chin up girl", dancing the can-can to troops on the eve of D-day. Wanting to do her bit for the war effort, Betty was founder, impresario and risqué lead dancer of the Non Stops; an amateur company who performed over 1000 troop shows. "the forgotten pilots" (2004) – Producer – Digi-beta 3 x 23'

"All we'd take were pyjamas and a map..." The story of the Air Transport Auxiliary, a unique civilian airforce of women pilots, disabled men and those thrown out of the RAF for dangerous flying who delivered planes from factory to the front line during the Second World War. Told through the first hand testimonies of those who'd take "anything to anywhere", this is a story of heroines, heroes and mavericks. Produced by: **Quintessence Films**. Tx: **ITV West**, 2005.

"the big monster dig" (2002/2003) – Director – Digi-beta 2 x 49'

Take one palaeontologist, one sedimentologist and one palaeobiologist, introduce them to a team of hardy fossil hunters and set them the task of investigating the life and times of a creature from the pre-historic world. In these 2 programmes we are on the trail of an iguanodon in Hastings and a pterosaur on the Isle of Wight. **RDF for Channel 4.** Tx: Sept '03

"the queen of camborne" (2001) – Director – Digi-beta, 24'

From young farmers clubs to Funeral Directors' dinners, Cornwall's legendary stand up comedienne Mrs. Rosewarne has played them all. The creation of octogenarian Lilla Miller, Mrs. Rosewarne is Cornwall's colloquial first lady! Keeping young in spirit through her comedy, this is the story of a remarkable 86-year-old and the alter ego that has given her a second lease of life. "porlock calling rockall" (2001) – Director & Writer – Digi-beta/35mm, 22'.

"acting my age" (2010) Director, Co-Producer, DV Cam, 35'

As a child, actor Dudley Sutton was forever being told to act his age. Now 77 he challenges the roles that, as an actor and an individual, he is expected to play. Documentary, drama, animation, polemic and poetry intertwine as Dudley questions and subverts the prejudices and preconceptions of age. Commissioned to open the 2010 Celebrating Age Festival in Bristol and entered for film festivals internationally. Produced by: **Quintessence Films.**

& in the archives...

My early work encompasses documentaries **"brought up on oysters"** (1989) - devoured by connoisseurs, dredged by oystermen (**Channel 4**), **"a place of heaven"** (1991) – a film looking at attitudes towards physical disability as experienced by the residents of St. Teresa's Cheshire Home – (**TSW**), **"weekend warriors"** a film about people who prefer to live in the iron age – (**HTV**) and **"a step across the water"** (1996) a documentary following 16 year olds from the Isles of Scilly as they leave the islands to continue their education on the mainland (**Arts Council**). I've worked on 3 series of **Channel 4's "watercolour challenge"** (1999 – 2001), 25 programmes as Producer/Director, 5 as Series Director; I've also been a Producer/Director on 2 series of **BBC1's** series on fostering and adoption **"a family of my own"** (1999 - 2000). I have directed a devised drama **"not fair"** (1990) with a class of Manchester 10 year olds – and in their eyes life wasn't! - (**BBC Schools**), have directed and self shot a cross selection of films for **"teachers tv"** and have also been responsible for directing (or guilty of depending on your viewpoint) 28 episodes of the pre-school children's puppet series **"tots tv"** (1992-94) - **Ragdoll** for **ITV network!**

other interests/work

I have led filmmaking workshops and been a visiting lecturer at UWE, Bristol Old Vic Theatre School, Bournemouth & Poole Film School and Manchester Metropolitan University. And I have a passion for boats! I'm the proud owner of a 15' cornish rowing skiff and have crewed on sailing boats in the Westcountry, New Zealand, the Canaries and on a passage from the Azores to Penzance. I also have interests in music, cinema, theatre, art, natural history, travel, current affairs, and history.
