Life Experiences and Work Experience

I have been, and still am, part of the Scouting movement (since age 15). I am now an Assistant Leader, where I have completed first aid training, GDPR, administration and safeguarding, which I redo every 2-3 years. I have dealt with a real fire drill, keeping children away from flammable chemicals and preventing a child from accidents, such as concussion.

I now run some evenings for the Beavers group (age 6-8) as the main leader in charge. I have raised money for our Scout group for equipment by doing bag packing at local supermarkets. During the summer holidays, I served food and drinks at scout events. As an assistant leader I get involved in organising and running fundraising activities.

During 2019 summer holidays, I participated in the National Citizen Service, a three-week programme, from 1-21 July. We went to PGL (outdoor activity week) and organised a charity event raising £500 for Catching Live homeless shelter charity by doing a Coffee morning and a Quiz night in Canterbury. I also was given the opportunity of escorting the Lord Mayor of Canterbury and guests to an NCS graduation ceremony as well as setting up the decorations. NCS has taught me about team building and leadership skills.

I love to learn new things. At secondary school, I looked after and gave tours to students from different countries and continents for 2 weeks and learnt about each other's cultures at school. I have looked after students from Spain, Italy, Thailand, Netherlands and Korea. For doing so I have received a school international certificate.

Other Interests

Throughout and currently in my university course I attend Film and TV club for 2 separate semesters. This allows us to create our own 5-minute film and 12-minute TV show by ourselves in teams using the equipment and facilities of the university. The clubs also go to the cinema with film students and discuss it afterwards.

I volunteer as an assistant leader for 2 groups. 2nd Herne Bay Beavers and 1st Reculver & Herne Beavers. Duties include organising a programme and risk assessments for activities such as camps, crafts, fire range, cooking and fire building.
