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I am a Director of Photography accredited for narrative fiction films & tv drama, a member of Illuminatrix and a cinematography Ambassador for Canon. My journey began on HETV in the North West of England, which gave me the opportunity to learn from some of the best of the best in camera and lighting, the experience informs my role and aids communication on set. Photography, in particular photojournalists and street photographers, is a source of inspiration to me. With time spent working on documentaries, news and current affairs I feel comfortable operating 'handheld' and enjoy choreographing my movement with the directors blocking to achieve an intimate feeling for a scene. The naturalistic style of lighting I practise, which can be seen throughout my cinematography, is an homage influenced by my admiration for American Realism and Impressionist painters whose aesthetic I endeavour to bring to my images. I enjoy collaborating with the director to create the visual narrative and aim to work as I like to live; with passion, compassion, humour and style.

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From winning the Kodak Commercial Film award it was exciting to be commissioned to create 'Change of Heart' for Canon, the film was screened during Media Tech Day London and at the prestigious festival of cinematography 'Camerimage', and to explore the unique qualities of the Sumire prime lenses. Since graduating from the renowned WFTV Mentorship Program I have been engaged as a public speaker at industry events and, as a member of the illuminatrix collective of female cinematographers, joined discussion panels at film festivals. I am a firm believer in the power of education and value the opportunity to guest lecturer in Cinematography at London Film Academy and UCA as an opportunity to pay it forward. The exhibition of my photography at the Louvre, Paris led to my first solo show in London and I continue to develop personal projects which now include alternative films. After over twenty years in the industry I am honoured to have been invited to be a full member of BAFTA.
